Please note, those individuals who wish to be considered for this program MUST have applied and be able to successfully obtain a national police check and a working with vulnerable people card before being offered a place on the program.

This program will:

- Provide 4 accredited units of competency from the skills set Induction to Disability (CHCSS0081)
 - Communicate and work in health and community (CHCCOM005)
 - Provide Individualised support (CHCCS015)
 - Facilitate the empowerment of people with disability (CHCDIS007)
 - Follow safe work practices for direct client care (HLTWHS002)
- Provide 1 accredited unit of competency from the Infection Control Skill Set (HLTSS00064)
 - Comply with infection prevention and control policies & procedures (HLTINF001)
- Provide a 20 hour industry work placement within the disability and individual support sector;
- Provide First Aid (HLTAID003), Working With Vulnerable People Cards and Australian Police Checks

Commencing Monday 23 August 2021, this 10 week program, will run 4 days per week (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday, 24 hours per week) and be a combination of practical hands on learning, theory and industry work experience placements.

The information session will provide individuals with advice on eligibility criteria, program content and the commitment that is required to be selected as a participant on this program.
